

# Our purposes

- serve as a not-for-profit, non-religious community organisation to assist disadvantaged members of the HongKonger community in Australia, including refugees and humanitarian entrants, who are in hardship.
- advance the human rights of the people of Hong Kong, and to preserve and promote its culture.
- foster communication and understanding between the local HongKonger community and the Australian public to build a stronger, more resilient HongKonger diaspora.

# Our people & partners

The VHKA is entirely backed by volunteers from all walks of life, whose contributions sustain the VHKA's operations. The VHKA draws on the expertise of many supporters to work towards its core purposes.

The VHKA works closely with a range of local community groups and NGOs, including multicultural community associations from across Australia and refugee rights charities.

The VHKA also works and engages with government agencies, including the Victorian Multicultural Commission and Victorian Police, to convey issues and concerns within the HongKonger community.

The VHKA is registered with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC) as a charity.

# Words from the Committee

It has been two years since a small group of us founded the Victoria HongKongers Association. For us and many HongKongers, these two years have been extraordinarily turbulent.

Far away from Hong Kong, we witnessed the erosion of many things we love about the city, while the world is under the shadow of a global pandemic. Many of us are also separated from our loved ones, wondering when will be the next time we would be able to see them. For those who have sacrificed much for Hong Kong's democracy and freedom, that 'next time' depends on their prison sentence.

HongKongers experienced fewer and fewer joyful occasions. If the last two years have taught us anything, it is the realisation that things may not have gotten better, we have the capacity to get better, and we got better. We are brought together by our shared love of Hong Kong and the shared hardship endured by HongKongers.

In our hardship, we learnt to trust and rely on each other. We learnt to tackle challenges in creative ways. We became more courageous. We became more efficient in organizing ourselves and supporting each other. We learnt to create our own joyful moments and cherish them.

We learnt that HongKongers are not defined by our challenges. We're defined by how we respond to them. And in the end, it's our actions, how we respond to challenges, however dire they may be, that reveals our true character.

The Committee is grateful for the ongoing support from the community, and our volunteers from all walks of life who made everything we did possible and asked for nothing in return. With other HongKonger community groups, the VHKA will continue to work hard, learn from our lessons to support the HongKongers diaspora in the coming years.

The freedom, human rights and personal safety of HongKongers have been rapidly deteriorating in our home town; The ongoing pandemic and the new way of life we all had to adapt to in Victoria have all caused tremendous challenges.

In normal times, people seeking asylum or seeking protection in a new country have already faced significant challenges in seeking appropriate support. COVID-19 had exacerbated the already challenging circumstances for them.

# Our services

For HongKongers who were in hardship especially when they newly arrived in Victoria, we had offered assistance mainly on a peer mentoring basis formed by volunteers from different ages, occupations, living experiences, and length of time living locally. Based on the individual circumstances and needs of each case, we had assisted migrants and vulnerable members of the local HongKonger community to gradually settle in the new environment by:

- providing related information e.g. studying, job seeking
- arranging temporary accommodations
- job referral
- referring individuals to trusted professionals or resources for medical treatment, legal and/or financial aid
- sharing the experience and skills they needed
- offering support for them to deal with difficult or new situations.

As it is easily foreseen there would be more HongKongers immigrating to other countries, including Australia after the international border reopened, we have been developing a "Buddy Team" program aimed to develop a more systematic network to assist our fellow HongKongers who would arrive in Victoria and require assistance.

Given the fact that it's much less likely we can return to our home town in the near future, it's more important to gather and unite the local HongKongers to support each other and preserve Hong Kong culture together. photo taken by a foreign journalist who had been the frontline of Hong Kong protests in 2019-2020




